Success of the United Artists for Climate campaign

COP30: 290 artists from 58 countries mobilized for climate action with United Artists for Climate, by Art of Change 21 in partnership with Labverde

Paris — November 26, 2025

COP30 (November 10-21) concluded in Belém last Friday with disappointment, as no concrete decisions were made on getting out fossil fuels. Against this backdrop, the global online campaign United Artists for Climate, led by Art of Change 21 in partnership with Labverde (Brazil), achieved remarkable success.

In just 12 days, 290 visual artists from 58 countries mobilized for climate action. Participants included internationally renowned figures such as Olafur Eliasson and Anish Kapoor, activist artists like Carolina Caycedo, and indigenous artists from the Amazon, including Moara Tupinambá. On the ground in Belém, eight artists participated directly in COP30, leading advocacy actions to highlight the role of culture in climate initiatives.

Campaign results on Instagram (November 10-21)

290 participating artists, reaching a combined audience of over +2,1 million followers. Posts generated 3 million views and 46 000 likes.

58 countries represented including Brazil, Cameroon, Colombia, France, Germany, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Iran, Mexico, Pakistan, Portugal, Taïwan, UK, USA, Zimbabwe...

Through Instagram, artists shared their reflections on the environment, expressing urgency, concerns for the future, and messages about forests, oceans, colonization, and climate justice. They also supported three key campaign themes: climate action, reforestation, and the formal recognition of culture in climate strategies. Many of them have also promoted their efforts to measure and reduce their carbon footprint.


Artists not active on Instagram, such as Anish Kapoor, Amy Balkin, Haroon Mirza, and Bo Zheng, collaborated with the Art of Change 21 team to create posts on their behalf.

On-site actions at COP30:

Eight Brazilian and Amazonian artists supported by Art of Change 21 and Labverde - Reiner, Margem do Rio, Christian Braga, Vitória Leona, Dayrel, Funkeiros Cult, Layse, and Sioduhi - led performances and advocacy actions connecting the COP30 event to the people who protect and defend the Amazon daily.

Thanks to Art of Change 21's Observer status at the UNFCCC, several artists obtained Blue Zone accreditation, granting access to decision-making spaces.

Alice Audouin, founder and president of Art of Change 21 and ambassador for We Make Tomorrow (a global initiative mobilizing cultural actors for COP30), actively participated in COP30 through interventions and advocacy. She spoke on November 12 at the inauguration of the COP30 Culture Day in the Blue Zone and participated in a roundtable at the Korea Pavilion on "Art and Carbon Neutrality for a Sustainable Future" on November 13.
